
Financial Summary



Where your money went:



INNZ acts on behalf of International Needs Humanitarian Aid Trust. This trust is responsible for fundraising and supporting several humanitarian and development projects across 19 countries around the world. In 2021, INNZ helped to raise over 1.3 million dollars in support of development work such as child education and sponsorship, clean water and health initiatives, social justice advocacy, building of new wells, women's empowerment and micro finance loans, vocational skills training, providing a new ambulance for a health clinic in Uganda as well as responding to the Covid-19 pandemic in food relief, protective equipment and financial resources.

TONGA



During the year International Needs Humanitarian Aid Trust raised over \$1.3 million dollars to support worldwide initiatives.

In the financial year of 2021, over \$1.06 million was sent to our international partners working in 19 countries. This impacted over 320,000 people through local initiatives to support community development programs such as education, Covid-19 relief efforts, setting up livelihood programs for vulnerable families, health and sanitation, human rights and social justice advocacy and to promote and support economic empowerment activities.

International Needs Humanitarian Aid Trust outsources all its administrative function to International Needs New Zealand (INNZ), therefore does not account for income or expenses. INHAT paid INNZ an average 21.5 % of donations collected to INNZ as an administrative fee.

Government Support

Through the ongoing support by the New Zealand Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade, over \$110,000 was given in support of the Solo Mothers program, run by International Needs Fiji.

This amazing program helps to support single mothers from informal settlements in Suva Fiji through vocational skills training and creating a business that will see them ensure a livelihood future of their own. Along with this, their children are supported through the INFIJI day-care program. We want to thank the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade for their continued support

Meet Lina Adhikary



Growing up in rural Bangladesh, Lina has faced more than most young children can bare, living in extreme poverty.

Her father is unable to work due to chronic illness and her mother is a labourer working on a local farmland. She also looks after Lina's four other siblings. Lina is as normal a kid as you would expect. She loves the colour red, loves playing with her friends and enjoys sports.

But at home, things are not so normal. Every year, when the monsoons come, her house would flood causing deadly snakes and insects to wander around them. Many people around them have died from the poisonous bites which creates a climate of fear for the village.

Because of their poverty, food has always been scarce. Lina remembers many times not eating for a day. With the efforts of International Needs Bangladesh community workers, they identified Lina and provided her the opportunity to join the International Needs Child Assistance Program. This gives her the opportunity to live and study at the International Needs Savar Girls Village, near Dhaka city. Her life in Savar is the polar opposite of her life on the lake and she has been given the chance to have a future for herself, and her family.

At Savar, she has been able to study regularly, eat good nutritious meals and experience the love the Lord gives to all. She has found a love for her studies (her favourite subject is English) and thrives with the oversight of the leaders. Most importantly, she's been given the opportunity to learn about Jesus, which is already changing her.

Her future dreams are now shaped by the love of her supporters, the love of International Needs Bangladesh, and the support she receives from other children in the village. Lina desires to serve the poor and helpless in her local community one day, by qualifying to become a nurse. We wish Lina all the very best with her studies and we know that she will continue to make a difference in the lives of those who need it the most.

Economic empowerment provides opportunities for people to break free from the endless cycle of poverty

International Needs prioritizes programs to provide vulnerable women and refuges an opportunity to gain a brighter future



Aid Support



Partnering with local leaders connected to communities, who at times need short-term aid support, enables us to act in times of need.

Whilst our partners do not directly engage in disaster relief, they do seek opportunities to ensure aid can be provided in times of need. This includes distributing food parcels to feed a hungry family or provide simple measures like wash stations to help prevent the spread of viruses or disease.

Providing short term food aid to victims of Covid-19, refugees and families affected by disasters such as floods or earthquakes and other basic human needs, is a way INHAT responds to those in need.

INHAT's main focus is toward development. We believe in following a process that creates growth, progress and positive change in the physical, spiritual, economic, environmental, social and demographic component of each of our partners' supported programs.



Over 7,000 families given support throughout the Covid pandemic in 2021.

Other support was given to victims of natural disasters in the Philippines and Uganda

Education



Education through student sponsorship and vocational training skills continues to be an encouragement to many supporters across New Zealand, in seeing lives being transformed and communities changed.

Bangladesh

600+ children supported through INCAP across 4 schools.

The drop-in centre continues to see on average 35 children in bonded labour each day receive basic education, a hot meal and clean clothing.

India

300+ children supported to attend school or online learning in areas of Siliguri and Dehradun.

Philippines

700+ students supported across many regions.

Thousands of other children helped through community social outreach programs.

Uganda

8,000+ students across three school are being supported in Uganda. New furniture, books and refurbished classrooms were provided to help encourage and motivate learning during a difficult year.

Kenya

In partnership with Ark Quest School, 150+ children are provided with education and vocational skills training.

We passionately believe child sponsorship is a powerful tool in child development, and we're committed to walking with children as they reach their full potential, ensuring they are known, loved and protected. International Needs supports over 13,000 children in nine countries through the International Needs Child Assistance Program. We believe every child deserves the right to an education and it is only through education that we will see the plight of poverty be lifted from this world. Education is the cornerstone to providing families and individuals with the tools and means to maximise their God given abilities and to break away from the bondage of poverty




Health & Sanitation



International Needs supports local indigenous leaders to provide access to basic healthcare.

When a person has access to basic healthcare, safe drinking water, and sanitation, everything about their life is improved.

International Needs works to provide access to basic healthcare, clean water, sanitation, and hygiene education to communities where vulnerable people live. The need is great, and resources are scarce. Support from people like you makes all this possible.



Human Rights



We believe in equality amongst all groups and freedom from discrimination. Girls and women in many countries are often viewed and treated as second class citizens. Whilst this attitude is changing in a lot of urban centres, in many rural communities, these views still persist. Many families view educating women as unnecessary and are therefore unwilling to spend money on formal education for their daughters. Often women are expected to begin work or marry and begin a family at a young age. As a result, many of these women have only basic levels of education. With a lack of education some are sold into slavery, some resort to prostitution and others beg, just to feed their children. Our partners focus on empowering local leaders to make changes to these cultural norms, to empower women and children and ensure every human is respected and is given the opportunity to a better life.
