

Registration

International Needs New Zealand (INNZ) is registered in New Zealand under the Charitable Trusts Act 1957 and the Charities Act 2005 (charity registration CC10941).

Purpose

INNZ aims to connect Christian partners in effective evangelism, discipleship and community development. INNZ is a member of International Needs Incorporated, a worldwide partnership of Christian organizations fulfilling the commission of Jesus Christ, supporting each other to see transformed lives, families and communities.

International Needs is a Christian mission organisation, committed to restoring the lives of those in the poorest countries of the world. 



Bangladesh

- Over 700 orphans and vulnerable children in the Dhaka region received regular Bible teaching and inspiration from the love of Christ.
 - New Zealanders continued to support a number of national church workers.
 - During the year, this increased by a further 10 national evangelists throughout Bangladesh, ministering to the majority Muslim population.
- INBD continued to see lives being changed and transformed by the powerful message of love and generosity that is shown by our team in Bangladesh.


GOALS FOR 2019

Ghana




- Throughout the year, children that attend International Needs' schools throughout Ghana benefited from a Christ-centred, quality education that continues to shape their lives and future.
- New Zealanders responded well to Edmond Vanderpuye's deputation where he presented the story of how IN Ghana was instrumental in getting new laws passed to see the abolishment of the Trokosi slave practises. Not only have they educated traditional tribal leaders, but led many to know the Lord Jesus, through love, prayer and devotion.
- Many national church workers are continuing to be supported by New Zealanders, to see the Gospel
 message spread across rural Ghana and into the villages. Our aim is to see this number increase over
 the next few years.

To continue promoting and supporting our partners in Vietnam to spread the Gospel and reach those who have not heard about the life changing message that Jesus brings.




Myanmar. It has been wonderful to support the "Hope for Now" project.

- Most of the work that we support in Ethiopia is in the Great Rift Valley provinces south-east of Addis Ababa. However, in spite of their remoteness, we receive reports of continuous church growth and church planting opportunities.


To develop and implement positive and accountable relationships between our Ethiopian partners and New Zealand donors.



Papua New Guinea & Bougainville


- There has been increase in ministry work and opportunities throughout the year.

Thank you to those who are faithful in supporting these ministries. We are continually seeking support in providing resources and materials like Bibles, audio Bibles and transportation to these national church workers.


- ACTS India has been an amazing support and pillar of strength

We pray and hope that the ministry will continue to grow throughout 2019 and see more national workers supported by local churches in New Zealand.



- Combined with our partners in the US and UK, INNZ will continue to support these national workers who are reaching communities from Hindu, Buddhist and Muslim backgrounds.






Uganda

Last year, New Zealanders were very generous in helping our national workers in Uganda attend an evangelist and pastors retreat.

This was a time where they were inspired, encouraged and motivated by each other in the work they are doing.

International Needs Uganda, have made great strides in reaching communities with the good news of Jesus Christ. 19,250 individuals received evangelism and discipleship support in 2018. Students at International Needs' schools benefit from Biblical Studies. During weekly devotions and worship they sing, dance, praise God and pray for the needs of their school, their community and each other. The students also enjoy morning assemblies where they are further instructed in the scriptures. These programs are meant to encourage faith and spiritual growth.





"We will continue to support OVC households to improve the care and protection of vulnerable children.  - INNZ, INUK, and INUSA, combined resources and were able to distribute over 10,000 Bibles to high school students throughout the Czech Republic





GOALS FOR 2019
