INsight into World of Joy success

Thank you to everyone who gave generously to bless those around the world last Christmas. Over \$100.000 was raised which not only brought joy, love, and hope but also relief to many families, after a tough year of Covid-19.

Gifts of Christmas food hampers, mosquito nets, water purifiers, women's hygiene packs, chickens, goats, children's bibles, school uniforms and back to school kits were distributed through our International Needs partners around the world. Here are some of the highlights of those distributions.

Christmas Food Hampers

Many children and families around the world were overjoyed and thankful on receiving a Christmas food hamper, particularly as Covid-19 has had a devastating effect on these families. Over 1400 children that New Zealand sponsors support were also given a Christmas food hamper.

A sponsored child from Siliguri, India said "When no one cares I am thankful to God they care."

Thank you to all who gave. Your gift has made a difference to many families including Yara's family who live underground in an old building in Turkey. They were so surprised to see International Needs Turkey knocking on their ground window and handing them a Christmas food hamper.



"We have been isolated and feeling we were in a cave for so long without anyone coming to see us, and no one even bothered to know how we have been doing. Thank you for noticing us; it feels so good knowing that we are not alone anymore".

Mosquito Nets

Repellent-treated mosquito nets were distributed to women, orphaned children and families in Bangladesh and Burkina Faso. Many live in slum areas where mosquitoes are prevalent. These mosquito nets will provide necessary protection against mosquito borne diseases such as malaria and dengue fever. In Burkina Faso, 50 women who had recently given birth at the International Needs medical centre were given a mosquito net. The women wanted to thank the New Zealand donors for their kindness, in protecting them and their children

Women's Hygiene Packs

In many countries around the world young women struggle to buy sanitary pads. Many do not have a choice but to use an old rag



which can lead to health complications. Unfortunately, this also prohibits them from attending school during menstruation due to the lack of sanitary pads.

Through the Christmas appeal, hundreds of young women in Ghana and Nepal received a women's hygiene pack including washable and long-lasting sanitary pads.

One young girl, Dzordozor from Ghana shared her appreciation:

"I often have to sell dry fish for days or cut dry coconut branches so that I can get enough money to buy sanitary pads. This will help me because I do not have to worry how to get sanitary pads for the coming months"

Bibles

Children's Bibles have been distributed to children and students in various countries

International Needs supports. The children were excited to receive their first bible in their own language so they can grow spiritually and learn about the incredible love of Jesus Christ.

"I am really happy that I am one of the pupils that got a Bible. I have wanted one but did not know how I could get one. This has been a timely gift and I promise to read it. On behalf of my classmates, I really appreciate your generosity and love you have shown us. God bless you so much" — Student from Uganda.

INsight into Women's Empowerment

This January saw 11 women graduate from the Lydia Vocational Training Centre in Nepal. Initially 22 women had come to the centre earlier last year but were sent home after seven weeks of training due to Covid-19 government lock down restrictions. Most of



the women were able to keep up their training and sewing assignments, whilst they were at home during the lock downs.


When the centre reopened in October 2020 the women who were able to return were excited to come back to the centre to finish their training. And now six of the women who were unable to return last year are completing the training this year.

As part of their vocational training, each of these women were taught valuable skills in sewing, jewellery making, nutrition, cooking, and music. Each trainee received information on essential health issues such as Covid-19, drug addiction, HIV/AIDS, first aid, domestic violence, and parenting skills.

The graduation ceremony was one of great celebration. Each woman returned home with a sewing machine, materials, and the skills to start their own tailoring business. As part of their training each woman agrees to pass on their knowledge and skills taught to five other women in their village, creating a ripple effect of empowering more women.

This year has begun with 22 women who will attend the five-month training programme at the Centre. The second will begin in August 2021.

INsight into Naogoan project

In the 1990's, Smith Adhikary (late International Needs Bangladesh Director) had a vision of seeing a school and vocational training centre being built in a very remote part of Bangladesh. This vision was to see many of Bangladesh's poor and socially deprived children

gain access to a quality education through the International Needs Child Assistance Program (INCAP). Since his passing, MacDonald Adhikary (Smith's Son) has continued to see this vision through. In partnership with International Needs Canada and with the generosity of many New Zealanders, the school and training centre was finished in November 2020. Even in the chaos of Covid, the team in Bangladesh were able to see the dream and vision come to fruition

The school is now able to cater for over 500 students through a variety of class levels as well as accommodating 75 children who have been rescued from bonded labour in Dhaka (Bangladesh's capital city). Whilst we are immensely proud of Mac and his team, we know that the work has only just begun as they impart wisdom, hope and opportunity for a brighter future to the children of the Naogoan region. INsight into Savar Children's Village

Since 1975, International Needs Bangladesh has been helping to educate and support hundreds of young girls through the Savar residential children's village.

Bangladesh has the fourth highest rate of child marriage in the world. According to resources 29% of young girls in Bangladesh are married before the age of 15 and 65% are married before the age of 18.

Child marriage around the world is associated with many harmful consequences, including health dangers associated with early pregnancy and lower educational achievements for girls who marry early. There are very high incidences of domestic violence and increased likelihood of poverty.

- Research shows that girls aged 10-14 are five times more likely to die during childbirth than mothers aged 20-24;
- Research into the lack of, or poor education and child marriage found that in Bangladesh women with primary, secondary, and higher



education, compared to women with no formal education, were respectively 24 percent, 72 percent, and 94 percent less likely to marry at a young age.


In Bangladesh there are several factors driving the high rate of child marriage. Gender discrimination feeds social attitudes and customs that harm girls at every stage of their lives and fuel the country's extreme high rate of child marriage. Desperate poverty remains a daily reality for many families in Bangladesh and many parents see child marriage as their best, or only option to safeguard the future of a daughter they feel they can neither feed, educate nor protect. Bangladesh is one of the world's most affected places by natural disasters and climate change. This adds an additional element of hardship to many families, especially those living in the most marginal and disaster-affected parts of the country.

Covid-19 has made the situation worse. The poverty clock has turned back more than 30 years.

"Against this grim backdrop we now have a pandemic that has intensified all the factors behind child marriage—poverty, lack of security of girls and the mind-set that girls are a burden for parents. With more girls dropping out of school, child marriages have increased extensively"

Another focus for the school is to rescue young women in bonded labour. Child labour in Bangladesh is very common. It is estimated that over 4.7 million children aged 5 to 14 are in the work force. 83% are employed in rural areas and 17% are employed in urban areas. Child labour is a real concern as this too deprives children of an education and other factors in child development.



The Savar children's village is a place whereby children from bonded labour, or at risk of early marriage, abuse, or discrimination, can come to live freely with their peers, receive a quality education and be empowered to fulfil their God given future in making a difference to the nation of Bangladesh.



We need your help. Since the pandemic and the increase in child poverty, marriage, forced labour and child abuse, International Needs Bangladesh is looking to improve and increase the intake of young girls into the Savar Village. Not only do we need help to enhance the facilities and build further dormitories, but also to help support the children through the International Needs sponsorship programme.

The goal is to build a new 6 storey dormitory, that will cater to look after 500 young girls, giving them a place to live, a place to be educated and a place where they too can enjoy their childhood.

INsight into National workers

The heart of International Needs ministry is to support local indigenous leaders to preach and spread the gospel in their own communities. International Needs New Zealand supports over 110 national workers in sixteen countries around the world. One of those national workers is Pastor Junel in the Philippines. In 2020, we were able to equip Pastor Junel with a motorbike and other ministry resources to reach those people in the mountainous region of outer Manilla, with the good news of Jesus Christ.

Here is a heartfelt thank you letter from Pastor Junel:

Dear IN Friends and Donors.

I always give thanks to our Lord every time I remember you in my prayers. It is a privilege and a big blessing for my



ministry to have this new motorcycle. I am so thankful for your support in my ministry through International Needs.

Last October we bought the motorcycle. It was a celebration for us that the Lord granted our prayers through you.

My ministries have become more efficient with the use of the motorbike. The tribal mission of International Needs Philippines has now become easier.

We are thankful that the Gospel can reach the unreached people who are under tribal religions. It was very special to share



food together, run activities and share the gospel with the Dumagat tribe.

Our home visitations to the recipients of International Needs aid are now easier through this motorcycle. Now we can visit even the farthest sponsored child family of International Needs to share the gospel and help them realise how great God's love is.

There are people in the mountains that do not have the opportunity to hear God's Word because they live so far from town. That is why I am so thankful for your support in my ministries through International Needs Philippines. Through our ministry, many people have come to know Christ. Through the mission of International Needs and support from our church to the tribe of the mountains; men, women, and children accepted Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour.

I am glad to give thanks to our Lord and to express my earnest gratitude to you for giving me a means of transport for the ministry. Because you support me

through International Needs, I can visit more people and churches. Thank you so much!

A wonderful and blessed day to both of you! I would like to express my very warm gratitude for your approval to support me. I felt so blessed that God answered my prayers by giving you as my sponsors and I am looking forward to finally know more about you too. And now, I also want to share things about me too.

I was raised by my guardians – my auntie and uncle since my parents separated. Our living is very simple. My uncle is a tricycle driver, and my aunt is a housewife. We live now inside a government sponsored subdivision. We have a very limited source of income and my guardians can hardly support my schooling. Thanks to your support

I am now studying in 2nd year of college with the course of Bachelor of Science in Entrepreneurship. I chose this course because I am dreaming of working inside an office and run a certain business someday wherein, I can apply my skills and hobbies in the field of creative arts.

INsight into Aid in times of Crisis

Whilst our partners do not engage in disaster relief, by partnering with local leaders, we do seek opportunities to ensure aid can be provided to those in need. Whenever a crisis strikes International Needs is there to help provide much needed support and care to those most affected. Whether through natural disasters, medical emergencies, famines, or even simple immediate needs, we want to ensure these families are given hope and shown the love of our International Needs family. Here are some ways we were able to help provide aid in time of crisis last year.





Covid-19 Hygiene Measures

In mid-October, last year, the government of Uganda eased some of the country's lockdown conditions and allowed schools to reopen for candidate classes. Students who were to sit exams could come back to school for exam preparation and learning.

To keep all children, schoolteachers, and staff safe from Covid-19 the government put in place regulations each school had to meet to reopen. Schools who met these regulations and hygiene standards were given a certificate of compliance and were able to reopen.

With help from International Needs New Zealand and other International Needs global partners the International Needs Schools in Uganda met the government requirements and were able to reopen.

Philippines Typhoon

Late last year, the Philippines were battered by two devastating typhoons. Super Typhoon Rolly and Typhoon Vamco left tens of thousands of people's homes, businesses and livelihoods destroyed or damaged. The typhoons affected the International Needs staff, national workers, Church pastors, sponsored children, and their families.

With the generous support of New Zealand donors over 683 families were given food relief to support themselves for several weeks. Damaged homes were rebuilt and roofs restored.

Together we were able to bring hope and relief to many families in a time of crisis.

Uganda Floods

In December heavy rain hit the community of Matale, Southern Uganda. Over 50 families were affected in this region; many had their crops destroyed, homes damaged and were left without much. Matale Boarding Primary School and Praise Nursery and Primary School were also damaged by the heavy rainfall.





We were able to send funds over to enable International Needs Uganda to distribute food hampers to the children and their families, along with mattresses, blankets, water containers and other essentials. They also assisted with repairing homes and providing the schools with iron sheets and roofing nails so their buildings could be repaired.
