Gospel Outreach

Ray Harrison's vision was to empower and support local church leaders in developing nations as they spread the Gospel. Leveraging their deep understanding of local contexts, languages, and cultures, these leaders are effective at making disciples within their communities.

Today International Needs New Zealand supports over **150 local leaders and gospel workers throughout the world.**

One of these leaders is Pastor Jose, residing with his family in the Barangay of Binitayan, Municipality of Daraga, Albay Province, Philippines. He ministers across Albay, Sorsogon, Camarines Sur, and Talac provinces, overseeing 25 churches and their pastors.

Each month, Pastor Jose leads gospel crusades in twelve local villages, where many people are coming to know the Lord. Last year alone, **200 people received the Lord during the crusades** held in the



villages of Banadero, Busay, and Cullat, in the Albay Province.

Pastor Jose conducts regular leadership trainings to prepare new pastors in their role and to deepen their understanding of the Bible.

Last year, International Needs New Zealand donated a van to support Pastor Jose's ministry work.

Pastor Jose expresses his gratitude upon receiving the van:

"As Head Pastor of Risen Lord Church, consisting of 25 outreach churches in different towns and barangays, our mission vehicle is a great help in our activities such as to our yearly youth camp, yearly Pastors' and workers' family day, monthly Pastors' meetings, monthly evangelistic concert crusades, team building, Pastors' and workers' leadership training, baptisms, church outings, children's ministry events, monthly prayer gatherings and emergency cases.

Because of this, we are whole-heartedly grateful to the sponsors and donors. Risen Lord Church is praying that God would bless everyone richly."

World of Joy Success

Thank you to everyone who gave generously to bless those around the world last Christmas. Your support has not only brought joy, love, and hope but also relief to many families.

Gifts of Christmas food hampers, mosquito nets, water purifiers, women's hygiene packs, chickens, goats, children's bibles, school uniforms and back to school kits were distributed through our International Needs partners around the world. Here are just some of the highlights of those distributions as we anticipate further updates from our partners overseas.

- Burkino Faso: **150 mosquito nets** distributed to pregnant women.
- Kenya: **50 Mosquito nets** distributed to 50 households.
- Kenya: 1 Keyboard and Sustain Cable, 1 Keyboard stand, 2 Kayambas, 2 Conga drums, 2 Tamborines, 2 Maraccas, 1 Acoustic Guitar and Tuner, 1 QiMei Harmonica were bought over Christmas for Ark Quest Education Centre.
- Philippines: 30 Families received gardening and farming tools and seeds.
- Philippines: **30 Families** received **water purifier units**.
- Philippines: **75 Kids** received a **back to school pack**.
- Egypt: 110 Families received Food hampers.
- Turkey: 50 Families received Food Hampers.



Human Rights

Chab Dai Project

Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute. Proverbs 31:8

Modern slavery is dragging millions around the globe into an abyss of misery and degradation. 1 in every 150 people worldwide is a victim of human trafficking, and over 400 million children are exposed to child sexual exploitation and abuse.

Since 2017, International Needs has partnered with Chab Dai's Legal Support Project (LSP) in Cambodia to guide and support countless victims to ensure that they receive the justice they deserve. With your support, the Chab Dai Legal Support Team have achieved the following:



- Handled **35 new cases** involving human trafficking, child sexual abuse, and child marriage.
- Provided legal consultation to 63 victims and their families.
- Contributed to **29 convictions** for forced marriage and human trafficking.
- Held 4 Consultative Meetings involving 63 participants to educate law enforcement workers on duties and obligations to investigate Human Trafficking.
- Organised a Legal Networking Meeting with 18 participants from 6 organisations, including the Ministry of Women's Affairs, to address legal support services for victims.

A Story of Survival and Restoration:

A 13-year-old girl who was promised a good job in the city, was then sold into slavery, and sexually abused. Through LSP's support, she was able to bravely testify her case with confidence. The accused was sentenced to 7 years imprisonment.

Words from her mother "I can't imagine what would be the result if there wasn't support from the Chab Dai Coalition. After my daughter was referred to live with ARM shelter, she has developed her skills and knowledge. She has a new plan to live in Phnom Penh and continue her studies at high school there."

Ghana Floods

In October, the Volta River Authority (VRA), spilled water from the dam to prevent the dam from breaching. Unfortunately, this caused severe damage, submerging homes and schools, leaving many homeless and exposed to water-related diseases.



Through your generosity we were able to raise over NZD\$9,600 to help families affected by the floods, with food baskets and female hygiene kits.

A victim's response to the support:

"I was living with my 6 children at Sikor when the flood came down to destroy all our properties and livelihoods. We were evacuated to Agbetikpo community school for safety. The comfort and independence we used to enjoy in our homes was no more. Things became really difficult for me, particularly when it came to supporting my family. Even though we did get some assistance from other sources, it was insufficient. It was a moment of joy when International Needs Ghana organised a medical outreach in our community to provide quality healthcare for victims. We were screened and provided with the needed medication. As if that was not enough, today we were also provided with food baskets and hygiene kits. This is indeed a holistic support. I sincerely appreciate the team for their great sense of help." — Madam Rejoice Ahiablame, EFC, Sikor

Nepal Earthquake

On Friday 3 November 2023, a powerful 6.4 Richter-scale earthquake shook Rukum (West) and Jajarkot. The disaster claimed 157 lives and left over 271 people injured. 369 schools were affected, and more than 8,000 homes were damaged, leaving many families homeless. With your support we provided aid to 457 families offering essential items.

In loving memory of Dieudonne

Dieudonne, our beloved friend and the project manager of International Needs Burkina Faso (INBF), was a beacon of hope and a tireless crusader who believed in the power of awareness, education, and action. His journey began not with personal affliction but with a profound sense of empathy for those who suffered. Witnessing the devastating impact of malaria on communities inspired him to join the fight to alleviate suffering and prevent its spread.

With heavy hearts, INNZ received the devastating news of Dieudonne's passing from malaria late last year. At only 37 years old, he left behind a loving wife and two young children.

As we bid farewell to a cherished friend, advocate, and change-maker, let us also find strength in the unity forged by a common cause – a cause that Dieudonne championed with unmatched passion and dedication in his role as project manager of INBF.

Please keep Dieudonne's family in your prayers, including his wife, two children,



and his father, who is the Director of International Needs Burkina Faso. If possible, I would like you to take a moment and pray for them during this difficult time.

Continuing Dieudonne's legacy: Fighting Malaria through Mosquito Nets

Dieudonne's legacy lives on through the continuation of his noble cause in the fight against malaria. Just as he dedicated his life to alleviating the suffering caused by this disease, we are committed to honouring his memory by ensuring that his efforts are not in vain.

In December 2022, INNZ funded mosquito nets for the INBF Medical Centre in Ophel as part of its World of Joy Christmas Appeal. Recognising the urgent need, INNZ and INBF launched a joint project in June 2023 to provide 1,000 pregnant women with mosquito nets and educational programs on malaria prevention at the medical centre.

With your support, INNZ has raised approx. NZD 7,090, providing mosquito nets and anti-malaria medication to 387 pregnant women through the INBF Medical Centre. However, we still need NZD 8,300 to reach our goal of 1,000 mosquito nets.

By supporting this initiative, we carry forward Dieudonne's vision of a world free from the devastating impact of malaria. Together, let us turn grief into action and make a tangible difference in the lives of those most vulnerable to this preventable illness.

Music brings joy!

Music is a universal language that speaks to everyone, especially children. It's a powerful tool that helps them explore different cultures and understand the world they live in. Beyond it just being fun, music education integrates with many other subjects, enhancing learning experiences. It allows children to express themselves uniquely, boosting their confidence and making their educational journey more fulfilling.

During 2023, through our Kids Concert and World of Joy donations, INNZ was able to raise funds for Musical Instruments. The funds were distributed to 3 schools in Bangladesh & Kenya.

At Ark Quest Education Centre in Kenya their goal is to establish a music classroom equipped with a variety of musical instruments so that they begin to teach a music curriculum. The plan is to recruit a qualified music teacher to teach the children musical skills including playing, reading music notation, and composition.

The students have been very blessed by the recent instruments that the school has been able to purchase – a keyboard with stand, Kayamba, Conga drums, Tamborines, Maracas, an acoustic guitar, and harmonica. Students are being given basic training on instrument handling and techniques.

Tertiary Education

The value and importance of education has been highlighted this past year at INNZ where we have seen 56% of the funds raised directed towards education initiatives across multiple countries.

INCAP sponsorship assists students through their primary and secondary school education. Following secondary school many students face financial barriers and cannot afford tertiary education. This is where tertiary scholarships come into play. The objective of our scholarship support is to empower students in need to pursue higher education, enabling them to give back to society, particularly in rural and remote areas.

INNZ provides tertiary sponsorship in six different countries: Bangladesh, Nepal, India, Uganda, Philippines and Cambodia.

We recently received an update from Kong Ai in Cambodia:

Kong Ai has now successfully completed her bachelor's degree majoring in English for Communication. She graduated and received her certificate at the end of December 2023.

Her work with Flame (an organisation that provides educational support to children in Cambodia) is as a bookkeeper and financial related tasks. She has grown in confidence and is now Flame's representative with the tax department and other government departments. She had received training with Chab Dai organisation financial forum which has built her skills and she is now able to complete the report well.



Kong Ai says **"Being a scholarship student isn't just about receiving funds; it's about** receiving the chance to prove what I can achieve. Your support is a stepping stone to my aspirations, and I am incredibly grateful for this opportunity."

As a fresh graduate, she has a goal now of wanting to study more about accountancy and also the Chinese language. This will give her a better income and will help to support her older parents in the province. Her current job allows her to support herself to live in the city, but she wants to earn more so she can help her parents also.

Economic Empowerment

Lydia Vocation Training Centre

In 1997, International Needs Nepal established the Lydia Vocational Training Centre in Kathmandu, helping more than 1000 women from 32 of Nepal's most vulnerable communities. Through this five-month residential programme, they build their skills through vocational training, setting up their own businesses or gaining employment.

Last year, 60 women from 12 districts in Nepal graduated from the LVTC programme, received sewing machines, materials, and the skills to start their own tailoring business. 25 residential trainees received warm jackets to help them to cope with the cold weather in Kathmandu. A collective birthday celebration was organised for all the Lydia women, where trainees received special birthday cards handcrafted by the women of a local church in New Zealand.

Binda's Success Story

Binda Danuwar lost both parents in Nepal's 2015 earthquake. In 2017, she completed Lydia's Basic Tailoring Training, subsequently receiving a sewing machine from IN Nepal. Afterward, she pursued a special design course and now runs a successful tailoring business from home. Binda has also trained over 40 women in her village, providing them with opportunities for employment.

Binda further says, "I am financially independent and very much happy and satisfied with my work. I feel happy to see the women whom I trained doing well and progressing. Some of them help me during my rush hours and I pay them for it."
