INsight into Fiji Moms **Project**



"Tessie. brokenhearted after losina her youngest child and with her 7-year-old gravely ill, found solace in faith and her church. Encouraged by her pastor, she applied for the Fiji Moms project, to learn a livelihood.

Despite a long waiting list, we couldn't turn away this grieving, abandoned woman with a fatherless child. When

a spot opened for Tessie at Fiji Moms, a glimmer of hope finally graced her face. Thank you for making it happen."

Many more women like Tessie need your support!

In Fiji, the struggle for women to achieve economic independence is evident in alarming statistics: women spend 2.9 times more time on unpaid domestic and care work than men, and the labour force participation rate among females was just 38.1% compared to 75.4% among males in 2022. Shockingly, 52% of Fijian women have experienced intimate partner violence, which surpasses the world average of 27% (World Bank, 2022).

These sobering figures paint a distressing reality for many women in Fiji, where economic dependence leads to isolation and social stigmatisation.

For Fijian mothers residing in informal settlements, this reality is even more pronounced. Limited education and low skill levels create significant barriers to job market competitiveness, leaving these mothers trapped in a cycle of poverty and vulnerability.

Amidst these challenges, a ray of hope shines brightly through the Fiji Moms Project, an initiative that is changing the lives of these brave women and their families. This transformative programme aims to equip mothers with the skills, resources, and financial support necessary to break free from the shackles of dependency and, become financially and economically independent.

The **Fiji Moms Project** is a 20-week vocational training programme, where mothers learn various skills in cooking, sewing, baking, housekeeping, screen printing and jewellery making. On graduation, each woman is given the necessary resources and support to start their own business.





Recognising that these mothers may struggle to attend the training while caring for their children, International Needs Fiji offers a day-care facility, ensuring that each child is cared for and receives daily nutritious meals.

The Project not only empowers individual mothers but also positively impacts their families and the wider community. Financially independent mothers create a better future for their children and contribute to the development of their neighbourhoods, inspiring others to pursue their dreams, fostering collective growth.

In April Dr Glenn Anderson (one of our supporters) spent time volunteering with a mission agency in DR Congo. During

his time there he was delighted to be able to visit his sponsored child along with other sponsored children from his church. These children attend a school in Lubumbashi that is dedicated to teaching deaf-

mute children. It is called "Ephphata" which is the Aramaic word spoken by Jesus when he touched the ears and mouth of

the deaf-mute man as recorded in Mark 7

v 34. Ephphata means "be opened". Some of the children are genetically deaf but many will have been exposed to infections during their mothers' pregnancies such as measles, mumps or rubella. Ephphata School teaches sign language to all the students so they can communicate and then proceeds to teach all the knowledge that will be needed to gain employment on leaving school.

Empowering communities with fresh water in Nepal and Uganda

In the face of increasing global water scarcity, nations worldwide are striving to address the challenge of providing access to clean, fresh water to their populations. In this article, we highlight some of the remarkable fresh water initiatives our partners in Nepal and Uganda are implementing to bring communities together, to combat water-related issues and to create sustainable solutions. These have been highly successful, and we continue to welcome further support for these critical initiatives.

Nepal: Harnessing natural resources for water security

Nepal, nestled amidst the majestic Himalayas, is blessed with an abundance of natural water resources. However, despite this gift, many regions still face challenges with water availability and quality. To address these issues, various initiatives have been launched:

- Rainwater Harvesting: Embracing
 the concept of "water self-sufficiency,"
 communities in Nepal have adopted
 rainwater harvesting systems. By
 capturing and storing rainwater during
 the monsoon season, villages can secure
 their water supply during the drier months,
 reducing dependency on distant water
 sources and promoting sustainability.
- Bio-sand Filters: In rural areas of Nepal, bio-sand filters are being introduced to purify water at the household level. These low-cost, low-maintenance

devices effectively remove contaminants, making water safe for drinking and cooking. Organisations are working to train communities in constructing and using these filters, thereby promoting self-sufficiency and reducing waterborne illnesses.

 Spring Protection: Springs are vital water sources for numerous communities in Nepal. Organisations and local groups



are actively involved in protecting these springs from contamination and environmental degradation. Properly managed springs not only ensure a constant supply of fresh water but also contribute to improved sanitation and hygiene practices.

Uganda: Tackling water scarcity through innovation

Uganda, known for its rich biodiversity and abundant water sources, still faces significant challenges in providing clean water to its citizens. Our partners have implemented innovative initiatives to address this issue:

- Borehole Rehabilitation: many boreholes, once drilled for water access, fall into disrepair due to lack of maintenance. Efforts are underway to rehabilitate these boreholes and establish maintenance mechanisms to ensure their sustainability. Regular maintenance by local technicians and water committees keeps these vital water sources functioning optimally.
- WASH Programs: Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) programmes are being implemented in schools and communities to improve water access and hygiene practices. These initiatives not only ensure access to clean water but also raise awareness about the importance of proper sanitation and hygiene in preventing water-related diseases.
- Community-Led Water Management: Encouraging community ownership and participation in water management has proven to be successful in Uganda.



Local Water User Committees are established to manage water distribution, maintenance, and infrastructure development. This participatory approach empowers communities to take charge of their water resources and encourages long-term sustainability.

The fresh water initiatives in Nepal and Uganda demonstrate the power of community-led efforts and innovative solutions in tackling water scarcity. By supporting these initiatives through your donations, we can collectively contribute to providing clean, sustainable water access to those who need it most. Together, we can empower these communities and make a positive impact on their lives and the environment.



On February 6th, two 7.7-7.8 magnitude earthquakes hit southern Türkiye and northern Syria. Over fifty thousand people lost their lives, over one hundred thousand people were injured, and millions of people were displaced living in tents or moving to other areas.

In response to the catastrophe, International Needs Türkiye implemented numerous relief operations to support those affected. Hot meals, winter clothing, tents, nappies, baby food, hygiene items and first aid kits were given. Around 3,500 families have been reached in these relief efforts.

During the Turkish summer, the team assisted 250 children who were still unable to return to school with social skill sets. Each set included stationery, art and craft items, and a simple toy. Holiday programmes were also held providing fun activities for 100-120 children at a time, with two sessions a day and an evening meal provided to attendees. The programme was accessible to children who were disabled during the disaster.

At the same time the team reached out to more than 500 women with peer support groups, respite from childcare, hygiene





packs and haircuts.

Thank you to all who donated towards the Türkiye Earthquake Emergency Appeal, making all this possible.

The team continue to work hard in the relief efforts as much support is still needed.

Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." — Matthew 28:16-20

Our vision is to continue to equip these gospel workers with the resources and training necessary to fulfil the great commission.

As they are the vehicle delivering the good news of Christ, we can be the fuel.

Fuel is needed in ministry resources of Bibles and Tracts. Vehicles such as motorbikes and bicycles are also needed to help fuel the gospel workers to go further and reach more people for Christ.

INsight into Huzaifa's story

Late last year it was brought to our attention that one of our sponsored children in Uganda had been suffering

greatly due to a large hematoma that had grown over his face. The need for medical intervention was urgent.

The team at IN Uganda took him to a national hospital in Kampala where he had appointments to work out a plan forward. A

team of doctors met and Huzaifa was told that surgery could be done to save his life The hematoma was continuina to arow so there was an urgency to get the surgery completed as

soon as possible. The cost of the surgery was \$10,000 NZD.

At the beginning of April, we shared the need with our donors and the response was remarkable. Within a week the needed funds were raised and Huzaifa went on to have the surgery within just a few weeks of receiving the financial support.

The team at IN Uganda supported Huzaifa throughout the surgery process and they have reported that he is recovering well after a 10-hour surgery. We continue to pray for Huzaifa as he adapts to the changes in his life – both immediate and yet to come. We are hopeful that Huzaifa will soon go back to school.

It has been incredibly rewarding to hear

feedback from both Huzaifa and his family.

The family is very happy and appreciative for the help rendered to Huzaifa.

His mother says that her son now has a nice face.

The father says " My son resembles me. I can now see how his face looks He is my real image"

Huzaifa has this to say; "The kids would find me on the way and run because my face used to scare them. This made me feel out of place and I would always feel bad about myself. I used to cover my face whenever I could

> walk outside in fear of being laughed at. I am glad that I can now walk with confidence. I am really happy for all that you have done for me my friends".


